RURAL PUBLIC LEADERSHIP DEMAND

- In 2024 70% of Minnesota's local races went uncontested
- Our leaders often don't look like the communities they represent
- Rural areas face unique leadership challenges
 - Urban Areas \rightarrow 1 in 950
 - Rural Areas \rightarrow 1 in 37

CIVIC ENGAGEMENT CHALLENGE



- Loss of civics education
- Loss of trusted local sources of information and news
- Narratives that individuate social problems – not collective issues requiring collective responses
- Advocacy is bewildering to most people – seemingly futile to others



FEWER SPACES FOR CIVIC DIALOGUE



- Decline of social capital Bowling Alone
- Fewer opportunities to interact with others with different views
- Interactions invite statements rather than conversations/ solutions
- Increased polarization/ nationalization of local issues
